



## 2018 Book Sale

OVER 50,000 BOOKS! That's how many books were for sale at the annual Friends of the Hockessin Library Used Book Sale held January 25th through the 28th. Hundreds of eager buyers filled Memorial Hall to participate in one of the East Coast's largest and best used book sales.

Thursday night was for FOHL members only, and set an all-time high for opening night sales. Dealers, both local and from several mid- Atlantic states, started lining up at 8:00 a.m. for a chance to be one of the first through the doors at 5:00 p.m. Friday was open to the general public, and again many were in line when the doors opened at 9:00 a.m. Sunday, the final day of the sale, featured our \$8 bag of books sale.

Over 100 volunteers help make this event possible. Some sort and collect books year round, while others help set up the sale, serve as cashiers, keep things in order during the sale and help clean up when the

sale is over at 3:00 on Sunday. At 3:01 volunteers and a crew from Discover Books remove all unsold books for recycling, box up books to be donated to the VA Hospital, local nursing homes and various children's charities, stack tables and store supplies in a large trailer for next year. This year was the quickest cleanup ever, with everything done in just one hour!

Sales for the event totaled over \$44,000. All profits from the sale are used to support the Hockessin Public Library. In the past year, some of the projects supported were prizes and supplies for both the Children's and Adult's Summer Reading Programs, the purchase of books and magazines, new furnishings, staff professional dues, a staff Holiday lunch, maintenance of the Reading Garden and an art display system for the Community Room.

You can help support the sale by donating your used books, DVDs, CDs, VHS movies, puzzles and games for resale. A collection is held from 9 to noon on the second Saturday of every month at the shed in the lot behind the Fire Hall on Old Wilmington Road. Sorry, no encyclopedias or old text books. # New Castle County Reads

For its 14th annual event, the New Castle County Reads program selected *The Orphan Train* by Christina Baker Kline.

Between 1854 and 1929 thousands of abandoned children were transported from the East Coast to find homes in the Midwest. *The Orphan Train* tells the story of one such child, now a 91 year old woman, who reaches out to a troubled teen in present-day Maine.

While supplies last, free books have been made available to book groups which register with the program. There are also 65 copies available at libraries throughout the county. The Friends of the Hockessin Library provided funding for 30 young reader editions to be used by two book groups meeting at the library. In addition, the Friends funded ten copies of *Fly Little Bird, Fly* by Donna Nordmark Aviles whose grandfather, Oliver Nordmark, traveled on an orphan train.

Since 2010 the New Castle County Reads program has featured an author talk and book signing. This year Christina Baker Kline will appear at The Chase Center on the Riverfront on Wednesday, April 25 at 7 p.m. for a free lecture.
